

## **Mount Somers Information Station**

We have made a start!!!! It has been a long time coming but the build of the Information Station has begun. Today in lovely spring sunshine (25<sup>th</sup> of September) the builder is "setting out" the building, Kane Brown from Gorge Earthworks has begun stripping the top soil and levelling the site. In addition some shrubs have had to be removed, while a large tree and one picnic table have been relocated.



Securing the site and meeting our Health and Safety obligations has been achieved by the erection of safety fencing, around the perimeter of the site. This fencing has been kindly provided by the Methven Lions.



Construction of the building should start early next month. Busck Prestressed Concrete, formerly part of the Bradford Construction group have confirmed that they will supply the concrete abutments for the building at the price which was indicated about three years ago - and that was at cost price then!



It is one of a large number of blocks of Mt Somers limestone that formed part of the columns of the Christchurch Roman Catholic Cathedral which was largely destroyed in the Christchurch earthquake (see accompanying photo).

The generosity of local businesses in rural communities is outstanding and allows projects to prosper that would have never otherwise got off the ground.

#### Limestone sculpture – or what

Have you seen this interesting piece of limestone "sculpture" in the Green. So what is it, and why is it in the Green?



While Oamaru limestone was used extensively on the exterior of the building, Mt Somers stone was preferred for its strength in the weight bearing components like the columns - both inside and out.

The columns still standing strong in the front of the building can be clearly seen in the photo of the damaged building

Purchased by the Schikker family and donated to the Green, this fluted piece of limestone is back just a few kilometres from its birthplace. It's a very moving tribute not just to the earthquake but also to the importance of our local stone in public buildings throughout New Zealand and Australia.

#### It's spring!!! Is it????

Not sure yet, and the forecast for the coming weekend doesn't look too promising. This spring weather seems to be very fickle this year. The farmers and gardeners are into one of the busiest times of the year so it probably doesn't leave a lot of time for reading. And that's a pity, there are so many good books coming onto the market.... in time for Christmas most likely. I hesitate to say that word, but in fact it is creeping around very quickly. New books to the library:

#### 'The Last Witch of Scotland' by Philip Paris.

A great historical read based on fact. It is set in Edinburgh about 1727, and is the story of the last 'witch' to be hanged and burnt in Scotland. This wasn't a rare occurance..... some 60,000 people were accused and punished (as in death) of witchcraft in Europe at this time. And the vast majority were women and children. It didn't take much to be accused..... just a wrong word at a wrong time, or misfortune falling on an enemy, or a falling out with the local minister. Scary times! This book held my interest throughout, and I recommend it.

Another great 'witchcraft' book in the library is **'Witchlight' by Susan Fletcher.** Once again it is based on fact, namely the battle of Glencoe in Scotland. A fabulous read much enjoyed by our local bookgroup.

I have just bought Susan Fletcher's latest book...

**'The Night in Question'.** It is very different from her usual style of writing, much lighter and slightly frivolous in parts. It took me a while to get used to, and then I got over my expectations of the book and actually quite enjoyed it for a nontaxing light read. It follows the death of a resthome manager which could be murder or just plain bad luck. She falls to her death. but maybe she was pushed?? Two of the residents are determined to find out what really happened, and there are many red herrings to sort through. I would describe it as a fun read. Not a typical Susan Fletcher.

#### **'Tell me Everything' by Elizabeth Strout.** Wonderful!!

I just loved this book, it is the author's latest about her favourite town in Maine USA and several of its inhabitants ,all of whom have appeared in her other books. For example, Lucy Barton, Olive Kitteridge, Jim and Bob Burgess, even Isabel Goodhue from Strout's first book 'Amy and Isabel'. She has written 10 books in total and the library has several on the shelves. And if you want to read more, I have them in my own library. I'm happy to lend. It was a treat to revisit characters' lives from other books, and learn what had gone on in their lives. Two of this series of books have been listed for the Booker prize , and 'Olive Kitteridge' won the Pulitzer Prize in 2008. It was also made into a film. **Other books to look out for:** 

the cure for boredom is books. there is no cure for books.

#### 'Whale Fall' by Elizabeth O'Conner.

In 1938 while the world is on the very edge of war, Monod aged 18. dreams of a life different from the one expected of girls her age on the remote Welsh island she calls home. And then when two anthropologists visit the island, becomes entwined in another aspect of the island and what it maybe offers. This has been recommended to me by a bookseller who described it as a haunting read. It is not a big book, barely 200 pages long and could well end up in our new section of smaller reads in the small wooden wall bookcase in the library.

#### 'In the Margins' by Gail Holmes

Another story based on fact.... The tale of Frances Wolfreston. an early book collector in the 1600s. But she was much more than her books.... She was, as a rectors wife, charged with enforcing religious compliance by informing on her parishioners. In taking increasingly bold steps to help the women and children of the parish, she attracts the ire of a patron of the church who questions Frances love and collection of books.... not encouraged at this time in history, particularly by a woman.

The following books are due out in Oct/Nov so I am keeping a close eye on them! No doubt they will duly appear on our shelves... watch this space!!

'Fire' by John Boyne... the third book of his trilogy.

'Dusk' by Robbie Arnott

'Shy Creatures' by Clare Chambers

'Freedom' Angela Merkel.

'The Last Muster' by Carly Thomas

'An Island to Oneself' by Tom Neale .

Finally, in a small community like ours, many people contribute time and energy (and money) to keep the community spirit alive and well. In our case, the library could not function if it weren't for our volunteers who give of their time willingly. If you can help out, please let us know. ## Scholarships open now

If your plans for 2025 include tertiary study, industry training, or personal development, then Advance Ashburton Community Foundation may have a scholarship for you.

Thanks to the generosity of a number of local donors, Advance Ashburton offers a range of scholarships to people based within Mid Canterbury. The scholarships range in value from \$1,500 to \$20,000.

This includes scholarships for any type of tertiary education as well as specific awards for study within the disciplines of health science, nursing, environmental studies, audiology, music, arts, agriculture, horticulture and aquaculture.

Due to the wishes of our donors, some scholarships are targeted towards people who are of Māori or Pasifika descent, have a home address in Tinwald, are hearing impaired, are newcomers to the Ashburton District, or have significant financial hardship or other disadvantage.

Whilst some scholarships can be awarded to first-year students, many are only available to students in their second or subsequent year of study. Students who have missed out on a scholarship in previous years are encouraged to apply again.

Scholarships are not limited to those studying at university or polytechnic. Industry training scholarships provide

financial assistance to those in vocational training or undertaking trade apprenticeships of any type.

Lastly, if you plan to undertake a personal development course in 2025 such as Outward Bound or Spirit of Adventure, there are scholarships available to cover the course fees for an experience of your choice.

If you're already following us on our Facebook page, we'll reveal our entertainers on October 18.


