Changed Lives

How a terminal diagnosis can impact the whole family

In his recently published book, "Life of Dai", comedian Dai Henwood writes that a terminal diagnosis "changes not only your life, but also alters the lives of those around you." It seems obvious, but often everyone's focus is on the person who isn't well, when in fact, the entire family is impacted by this news.

A husband or partner may now have to be a caregiver. Children must learn to live with a parent who can no longer do the things they used to. A parent may now have to support a sick child. Everyone's roles change.

A sense of perspective is helpful when families are faced with big changes. Along with the challenges of health, finance and future plans, small things can derail the best of intentions. Having to suddenly manage lawn mowing, putting out the rubbish, dealing with laundry and the odd marauding vermin when they haven't been your areas of expertise, can be a real test of one's equilibrium.

While HMC can't solve all the challenges, they are able to give free support in a number of ways. Counselling, including strategies for managing, is available for clients and their families as they adjust to the new reality. Complementary therapies, including massage, reflexology and reiki, can provide relaxation and some relief from symptoms.

There is a lively activity programme on offer at Kōwhai House including Armchair Travel, pamper sessions and arts and crafts. Volunteers can provide transport if needed.

Maintaining mobility is important and the physical therapy classes run by Matt Roxburgh, a specialist trainer from EA Networks, are a popular option to help maintain strength. The classes are tailored to suit each person and provide a safe, supportive environment with lots of laughter.

As the illness progresses, the needs of the client and the family will change. Isolation may become a problem and HMC has volunteers who can assist with sitting and outings. This provides some respite for caregivers and a welcome change for the person who isn't well.

With all the challenges that a terminal diagnosis can create for a family, HMC provides support every step of the way.

There has been a lot of work happening lately to get test wait times down to an acceptable level. To help with this, NZTA have changed the length of time you can drive on an overseas license. From November you will be able to drive on your overseas license for 18 months from your last arrival into New Zealand. This gives you an extra six months to convert your license, but don't leave it too long before starting to prepare for your license conversion.

The time extension is only available for two years, then it reverts back to 12 months.

Just remember, once you have been issued a New Zealand license, you can no longer drive on your overseas license, even if you leave the country and come back later.

We are starting to see a reduction in wait times for tests, so don't forget to check for cancellations, if you are ready to do your test earlier.

We are getting lots of registrations for our March Road Code course already, so the need is still there. It's wonderful to see so many referrals from past students and it's always a joy to see past students out in the community enjoying their independence.

Many thanks to the Community Trust Mid and South Canterbury for supporting us again with a generous grant. This enables us to continue helping so many people into their driver's license. We can't run our programme without the support of our sponsors.



As usual Spring produces its mixed bag of weather but overall its nice to experience some warmer weather and to be able to see and interact with neighbours and community over the extended daylight hours.

Reported crime around burglary, theft and damage averages 8 per week throughout the District over September. Those affecting Methven/Foothills area amount to 4 over the month relate to burglary and a stolen vehicle, around Lismore Mayfield Road, Methven Highway, Double Hill Run Road and Boltons Road. Don't assume everything on your property is safe, always prepare for "what if". Some crimes are opportunistic, others are planned, especially if there is a need for a requirement. Also a notable increase in text and email phishing scams impersonating banks, NZTA, NZ Post and telecommunications companies. Check with the actual company if unsure and do not click on any links!

A COMMENT:

Once again it is that time of the year, the plant shops are well filled with a brilliant display of all manner of garden varieties, it is time for planting out. That is if you already have prepared the ground and worked in plenty of compost and fertilizer. Tomatoes are the one plant amongst others which I just have to grow.

I have five plants waiting for me to place them in the soil, they have been doing very well in their pots but can't last there any longer.

I refrain from buying tomatoes in the winter months as I consider it time to eat other things and what's more they are too expensive. It now being October twice I have bought tomatoes, they were very good looking, nicely shaped a good size not too big or too small, but they lacked one essential thing, the most important item and that was flavour. These supermarket tomatoes have no flavour, I remember a farmer from past times saying that lamb was insipid! These so-called tomatoes were certainly insipid. I have been given three plants which a friend has cleverly raised from seed salvaged from her previous years harvest, those plants are growing very well having been cared for in my lounge until a week ago when I moved them to the veranda to harden up. I have also bought two 'Beafsteak' plants a variety I appear to have success with. The one thing I aim for is to have tomatoes that taste like tomatoes, I feel confident these grown in my own garden soil will be proper tomatoes both in appearance and flavour. My growing of tomatoes has not always been a success, last year very good two years ago failure beyond that I have no records, however, I would say that with practice and persistence these types of activities tend to improve.

October 22^{nd,} I attended the monthly U3A gathering, U3A is for life long learning, and I believe that is very good, in this life we can never know or understand all that happens or has happened in the world we belong to. On this occasion we listened to an illustrated lecture by Professor Hallie Buckley, her subject 'The tales dead men and women tell.' That was narrowed down to - Bioarcheological investigations of the lost lives and forgotten stories of Otago's gold miners. What a hand full! Professor Buckley is a professor in the department of Anatomy at University of Otago. Her research covers a wide range with interests that focus on the effect of different cultural and ecological environments on the health and disease of prehistoric peoples in the Asia-Pacific region. At about that point I was lost! Just what did I learn?

Well, I learnt that these highly skilled academics can acquire bones from museums or dig them from very old graveyards grind up minute particles of bone perhaps 150 or more years old and get a clue as to what this unfortunate fellow died of. Is that useful to mankind? I would wonder but I just don't know, perhaps if I was a professor of Anatomy I might understand. One thing I did learn was that it is rather amazing just what these folk can discover about us long after we have deceased, perhaps that is a good reason to be cremated, although I guess things can be learnt from the ashes. I did at one time read of the boy king Tutankhamun, the Egyptian boy king who's tomb was discovered in 1922, I don't know how many hundred years he had laid in his tomb but those clever archeologists were able to decipher somethings from his remains I seem to remember that the conclusion was that he had died of a form of cancer, he died as a teenager.

But I am not interested in excavating human remains, I noted a lady near me who commented that it would be better if the room had windows that allowed one to view the scenery, windows are not favoured in meeting rooms in these times as 'Power Point' presentation don't work well with too much light. It was a well-presented address and to prove this there were a number of questions at the conclusion. I'm sure a number of attendees got considerably more out of it than did I.



Co-funding insulation in the community

As a locally owned cooperative, EA Networks is passionate about building awareness around energy efficiency, and how to keep power bills down. As part of this work, EA Networks is now partnering with Community Energy Action to commence an initiative focused on insulating up to 100 homes in Mid Canterbury, in conjunction with the government's Warmer Kiwi Homes scheme.

By supporting other funding sources, EA Networks is helping eligible people achieve warmer and more energy efficient homes. "Helping local families and individuals is important to us, particularly when it comes to warmer, drier, healthier homes that are cheaper to heat," said Onno Mulder, CEO, EA Networks.

Community Energy Action is stepping in to support the work, commencing a door knocking campaign around target areas in Ashburton. "We need to get people on the ground, to connect with those that might be eligible for funding and reassure them that it's not too good to be true and we can help", said Louw Bezuidenhout, General Manager, Community Energy Action.

The door knocking campaign commenced on Monday 14th October, with a goal to insulate the first 40 homes by 31 March 2025.

"We're starting this work now because it can take time to get the insulation in, and we want homes to be ready before winter next year", said Jessica Harris, Customer Experience Manager, EA Networks. Building community awareness around the support available is also key. "We're connecting in with local community agencies and helping to build awareness of the support that is currently out there," Ms Harris says.

To be eligible for Warmer Kiwi Homes funding, a recipient must:

- Be the homeowner (owner-occupier) of a home built before 2008, and either:
- Have a Community Services Card (CSC) or SuperGold Combo Card (with an expiry date and NZS / CSC on the back), or
- Own and be living in a home in a qualifying area.

Anyone who thinks they might be eligible can contact Community Energy Action in the first instance, on 0800 438 9276.
