Mayor Neil Brown's office overlooks the tree, and he says it's great to see it back in its original home in Baring Square East.

"It looks absolutely fantastic in our newly redeveloped Baring Square against the backdrop of our clocktower and the new Library and Civic Centre.

"It gives our town that true festive feel and sets the stage beautifully for the Light Up the Night celebration, where we'll all gather to see it light up."

Light Up the Night is taking place this Saturday from 6pm around the town tree, it will be an opportunity to welcome in the festive season with an evening of music, live entertainment, and food.

Santa and his elves will be mixing with the crowd and posing for photos, there will also be free face-painting and balloon twisting for the kids. Those visiting are encouraged to dress festively and capture the moment with some free snaps in iHeart Radio photo booth.

There will also be plenty of tasty food on offer, with a food court and 199 Café in the library staying open late.

On the stage, the Christmas spirit will be well and truly alive, with a lineup of local talent including Libby Higson, Murran Carter-Buller, the Decibels Choir and performers from Life Dance Academy.

Mayor Neil Brown says that evening will culminate with the lighting of the tree at around 9.15pm.

# Time to put Santa on the agenda

There are two full Council meetings, plus meetings of the Stockwater Transition Group and the new Three Waters committee, as well as the day-to-day business of collecting rubbish and recycling, providing water and roads, and dealing with sewerage.

Those are core services, administered largely by staff in Te Whare Whakatere, but the summer holidays are also a

busy time for the Ashburton Library, Ashburton Art Gallery and Museum, Open Spaces team and EA Networks Centre. So busy, that we have put all the different activities into one holiday booklet that will soon be available in printed form and on our website for instant access.

It's 12 pages of crafty fun, physical adventure and Christmas festivities that are happening in December and January, and many of the activities are free.

There are old favourites, like the Great Santa Hunt at the gallery and museum - this has been running for more than a decade and opening night is quite the occasion, with the facility in darkness and kids of all ages armed with torches and trying to find the different Santas.

There are new activities too, like the jumping platform at Lake Hood, which was very busy this last Monday night when the weather was hot. You'll also see when we are visiting some of the district's outdoor swimming pools with our inflatables.

# \$2.33m for sewer main renewal

The final piece of work in a major project to upgrade Ashburton's wastewater system will get under way early next year, when a new trunk main is installed between Trevors Road and Milton Road.

The old trunk main is almost at capacity and the new pipe will be larger, and relocated to a paper road that runs parallel to the Ashburton River.

Infrastructure and Open Spaces Group Manager Neil McCann said the \$2.33 million project was awarded to Ashburton Contracting Limited and work would begin early in 2025.

"We expect the project to be completed by June and the new pipeline will run underground from an existing chamber near Trevors Road to Milton Road, where it will connect to the new pipe that crosses under the river and on to the treatment ponds at Wilkins Road.

"The new location of the pipeline means it will no longer cross private farmland and it can be largely built offline before being connected. Residents should experience no disruption to their usual services."

The old trunk line will be decommissioned and removed.

Mr McCann said Council had been strategically renewing the wastewater network over the past few years.



"The town's original network of sewer pipes was established in the 1920s and we still have a few earthenware pipes, though they are being systematically renewed. This last big project really future proofs the system and allows for residential growth."

This new pipeline will collect wastewater from the central area of Ashburton, including Hampstead. A new wastewater main was installed from Bridge Street to Wakanui Road and Milton Road in 2021, to handle residential and commercial growth in the north-east.

Mr McCann said the Ashburton wastewater scheme was made up of about 130km of pipes, with connections to 7600 properties, and it was Council's job to ensure the scheme ran safely and effectively.

"We contract ACL to manage day-to-day operations, repairs and maintenance and as there are very strict rules for dealing with human waste, all our community wastewater schemes are heavily monitored."

# Feedback sees changes

Council adopted the revised Solid Waste Management and Minimisation Bylaw last week, following public consultation that resulted in 58 submissions and a number of changes based on the feedback.

Events on public land that are unlikely to generate waste or attract many people are excluded from requiring a waste management and minimisation plan. Council will take an educational approach to construction waste site, and will supply local builders with information about recycling options.

Other topics raised by submitters included the new "green" kerbside bin from 2026, Council's ongoing recycling bin audits and difficulties using rural drop-off bins.
