Morena Nick,

Thank you for your patience.

I have spoken with both James Long and Scott McKenzie.

In general, Waka Kotahi is comfortable with the conceptual design of the intersection.

There are details around the green surfacing for the cycle lane, the limit and no stopping lines, and the shoulder outside of the carriageway that could be negotiated at a more detailed design stage.

For instance, provided that cyclists are not directed back into the carriageway, the additional metre shoulder and extensive green surfacing may not be necessary. Further, if visibility is able to be achieved at the intersection then no stopping lines maybe unnecessary. Also, as a reminder, at the detailed design stage, we would want to ensure signage and lights meet our approval.

From an environmental planning perspective, if you or the planner send me the (draft) resource consent application and AEE, I can proceed with providing third party written approval.
